#### PRESIDENT and SECRETARY'S REPORT JANUARY - MARCH 202-



Happy New Year and Best Wishes for a 2024 filled with hope, peace, happiness and successful endeavours. We are continuing to creatively present a range of Community events in a COVID-19-safe environment, which everyone can enjoy and participate in.

As a result of a 'Seniors Be Prepared Morning Tea' held in the Park Hall last year and a detailed interview with Peppercorn Services by the President and Secretary focusing on what the Bowen Mountain community needed in regard to Emergency Services, Peppercorn Services have prepared a Resource Card on Services available in the Hawkesbury. This resource card includes information on Peppercorn Services, Emergency Contacts, Government Services, Wellness and Mental Health support, Legal Services, Community Centres, First Nations, Food Hampers, Meals and Emergency Relief, Housing Assistance, Drug and Alcohol Services. As part of our Community Outreach, Martha and Liz delivered 24 Xmas gift bags to residents. Many residents have asked that the Bowen Mountain Cookbook and Bowen Mountain history be reprinted. This book was written in 1988 to mark the Bicentennial and only 200 copies were made. Copies of the Cookbook and History (*A Cook's Tour of Bowen Mountain*) reside in the National Library in Canberra and also the Hawkesbury Library in Windsor. The Bowen Mountain Association is currently investigating the feasibility of reprinting and updating the original 1988 book.

Several residents have raised the question of contacting the Aboriginal Land Council to ascertain boundaries on Bowen Mountain. The BMA will investigate this further and report back in future Newsletters.

The BMA received communication from Hawkesbury Council answering the BMA's questions regarding the roads on and around the Mountain and updating us where work had been undertaken to improve road conditions.

The BMA is investigating the feasibility of getting community batteries for the Household Solar program at Bowen Mt. This program is planned to be installed in Blaxland, East Blaxland and Hobartville. Residents will still be connected to the grid but they will get cheaper electricity bills. More information should follow in future Newsletters.

Wishing the Bowen Mountain community an enjoyable Easter and a colourful Bowen Mountain Autumn.



## **Mountain Dragon**

Read on to find out more about the dragon in Lance's cover photo!



## Mountain Dragon (Rankinia diemensis)

"Rankinia is a genus of small <u>agamid</u> reptiles. As currently delineated, it is <u>monotypic</u>, containing only Rankinia diemensis (Gray, 1841), also known as the mountain heath dragon or mountain dragon.

It is endemic to Australia."

#### "Distribution and habitat

It occurs in the uplands of New South Wales and Victoria, as well as in Tasmania, where it is the only native agamid. Mountain dragons are found in dry woodlands and heaths with access to open areas for sunning themselves. They are oviparous and feed on ants and other small invertebrates."

#### "Description

Their overall colour is grey to reddish brown, with two rows of lighter-coloured paravertebral stripes or blotches running down their backs. These stripes are deeply scalloped, so they appear like two series of blotches. They can have cream-coloured bellies. Individuals can grow up to 20 cm in length, although the average length is somewhat smaller, with females typically growing larger than males. The average snout to base of tail length is 7.5 centimetres but can be up to 9. They have a row of enlarged spinose (spikey) scales on each side of the tail bases.

The mountain dragon appears similar to the jacky dragon, but can be much redder, and the inside of its mouth is pink (compared to the yellow of the jacky dragon).[6]

They breed in summer, laying 2–9 eggs in a burrow."

These training scenarios are designed to challenge our firefighters to ensure they are prepared for any situation they attend; this will include navigation training through dense bush land for fires that start in remote areas.

this year brigade members will conduct EV training to become more familiar with the dangers and hazards associated with EV's in motor vehicle accidents.

Here are some lovely recipes to try especially when the weather starts to change.





# **AIR FRYER SCONES Ingredients:**

225g Self-raising flour 50g unsalted butter 35g caster sugar 50g currants 1 medium egg 60ml milk Small egg (beaten for egg-wash)

#### Method:

Place flour, sugar and chopped butter in a bowl and mix thoroughly until resembling coarse breadcrumbs. Add currants, egg, and mix well.

Add milk a little at a time until a soft dough.

Add milk a little at a time until a soft doug Roll out dough onto floured board. Using a cookie cutter, make equal circles. Place in fryer, brush egg wash on top. Fry for 8 minutes at 180 degrees C. While hot spread with butter.


