SOME HISTORICAL CURIOSITIES ABOUT BOWEN MT.

Did you know that:

- In 1962, the developer Milton Grant took out a full-page ad in the Sydney Telegraph advertising Bowen Mountain as a mountain paradise, where you could hide away and loaf the weekend away with a range of family amenities to enjoy. (See the ad by Grant above.)
- The Great Fire - on January 10th, 1914, George Meares Countess Bowen's, (whom Bowen Mountain is named after) historic mountain homestead was destroyed by fire.
- Bowen Mountain Toll Gate Days - before it became a residential suburb, visitors to the mountain in the 1940's had to pay a one-shilling toll to a local gatekeeper to access private tracks, dense trees and picnic areas and original gardens. After paying a shilling the gate was opened with the gatekeeper reminding people to "close the gate when you leave".

BOWEN MOUNTAIN BIRD WALK

Report

On Sunday May 24th an enthusiastic group of 15 Bowen Mountain, Hawkesbury Environment representatives and other Hawkesbury residents gathered for a community bird walk led by Eric Finley and Lance Mitchell. Both Lance and Eric are local residents with a life-long interest in wildlife, particularly birds.

After a wet week, with raindrops still on the ground, the skies cleared as we all met at the hut in Bowen Mountain Park. The group walked from the Park along Duffy's fire trail on a special route of 3.5 km organised by Lance. Lance knows the Bowen Mountain bush trails "like the back of his hand." The walk took over 2 hours 10 mins and 30 species of bird were sighted. We had just returned from the walk when the mist and cloud moved in. A delicious morning tea and a Q & A session in the Park hut capped off a most enjoyable and memorable morning.

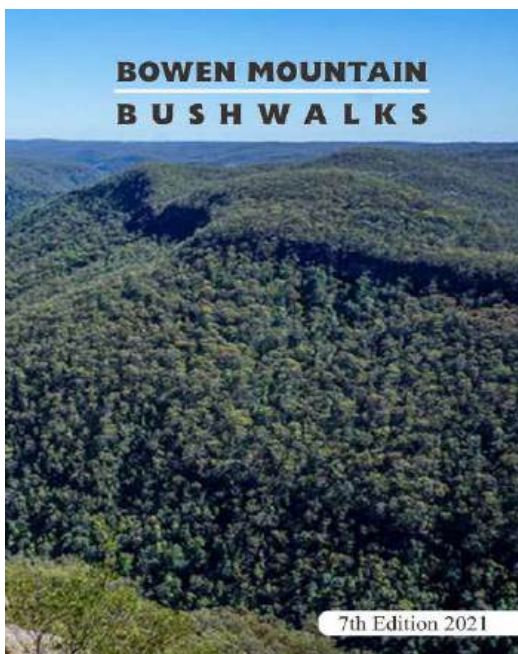

SOME INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT THE ROSE ROBIN



Eric Finley's superb photo of the Rose robin (*Petroica rosea*) adorns the front cover of the Newsletter and was the bird featured on the notice of the recent bird walk. It is a frequent visitor to the mountain, particularly in winter. It is a slender robin with a relatively long tail. It is the male robin that has the distinct rose-pink breast, dark grey above, with a white patch above the bill (frontal patch). The lower part of the underbody and outer tail feathers are white, the wings and upper tail dark grey. Females, however, are mainly brown-grey above with a small white frontal patch, white outer tail and wing bars, and off-white below, with occasional pale pink wash across breast.

The Rose Robin is the most acrobatic of the red robin genus with a darting, tumbling flight. It is very active, flitting from tree to tree or to the ground, and will not return to the same perch, unlike other robins. This robin forages higher up in the canopy and feeds on insects. It will also feed from the ground preferring wet forest and rainforest habitats during spring and summer, moving into drier, more open habitats during autumn and winter. The Rose robin is mainly found in the temperate zone, however it can also be found in sub-tropical zone in south-eastern Queensland and north-eastern New South Wales.

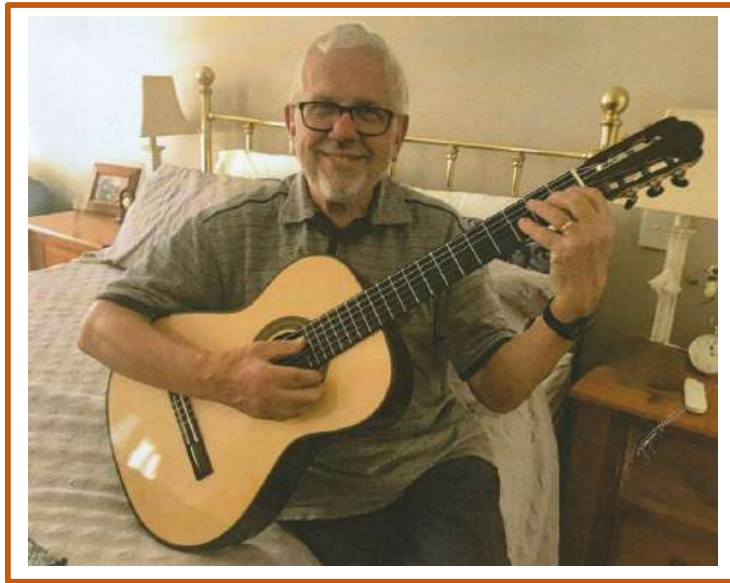
Rose Robins are quite sensitive to habitat fragmentation and the loss of understorey. Unfortunately, land-clearing for urban development, especially along the coast, has caused local extinctions of Rose Robin populations as well as killings by feral cats.

Medicare Urgent Care Clinic - Windsor



The Medicare Urgent Care Clinic - Windsor is now open at Myhealth Kable Street Medical Centre, 2 Kable St., Windsor. Take the lift to the 1st Floor.

Medicare Urgent Care Clinics provide urgent care services for conditions and illnesses that are episodic and not immediately life-threatening, such as closed fractures, wounds, and minor burns (see list in photo). These services are bulk billed with a Medicare card, resulting in no out-of-pocket costs to patients.

The Medicare Urgent Care Clinic - Windsor is open 7 days a week from 8:00 am to 10:00 pm. You can call them at (02) 4577 5622. You can walk-in without needing an appointment or referral.

The Medicare Urgent Care Clinic is staffed by highly trained medical professionals and provides culturally safe, equitable and accessible care to all people, including vulnerable and young people.

Our family has had to visit the Medicare Urgent Care Clinic – Windsor on several occasions over the past few months. In all cases, we have found the treatment we received from staff to be professional, caring and of the highest quality. This relatively new service fills a much-needed gap between the regular GP clinic and the hospital Emergency Department.

Chicken and Camembert Bake

Ingredients

Chicken breast fillets – one per person
3 slices of prosciutto per chicken breast.
30 grams camembert
4 tablespoons hot water

Method

- 1) Preheat oven to 180 degrees.
- 2) Slice chicken breasts to create a pocket.
- 3) Stuff with camembert.
- 4) Wrap the prosciutto around the chicken breast to close off the pocket.
- 5) Place on a tray with baking paper.
- 6) Bake in the oven for 25 – 30 mins. or until golden brown
- 7) Serve with Dijon mustard and veggies of your choice.
